Prix de Lausanne 2025 Young Creation Award 2025 winners

International ballet competition for young dancers - Beaulieu Lausanne

Lausanne, 5 February 2025: For the fifth consecutive year, numerous students from our partner schools have embarked on solo choreographic creation for the Young Creation Award. During an evening entirely dedicated to choreographic projects, two young choreographers were awarded the Young Creation Award for their respective original choreography, presented to the Jury and the audience at the Beaulieu Theatre. The evening concluded with a public rehearsal of the Partner School Choreographic Project, giving the audience the chance to discover an original piece by choreographer Jessica Lang, featuring 26 young dancers.

The winners of the Young Creation Award 2025

56 young choreographers (34 girls and 22 boys) from 23 partner schools of the Prix de Lausanne submitted their applications for the fifth edition of the Young Creation Award. After a video selection of the submitted choreographies, five choreographers were chosen to come to Lausanne with their dancers to refine their coaching and finalise their creation under the supervision of professionals. The five finalists presented their original creations, danced by a student from their school, this evening. The purpose of this choreographic competition, held alongside the Prix de Lausanne, is not only to stimulate choreographic creation but also to introduce young dancers to the art of coaching in preparation for a career in choreography.

The two winners of the 2025 edition are:

- **Henry Lichtmacher** (United States) with his variation "20 Miles From Shore", danced by Alex Westerman (Houston Ballet Academy).
 - Music: 'The Ballerina', Lars Meyer.
- Alexander Mockrish (Sweden) with his variation "Extinction", danced by Caroline Quiner (ABT Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis School).
 - Music: 'Etude Nr 1 for String Quartet', Peter Sandberg.

Their creations will be integrated into the repertoire of contemporary variations for the Prix de Lausanne 2026 for future candidates. The two choreographers will be invited to the next

Prix de Lausanne to coach the candidates who choose to perform their work.

These two winning variations will be showcased again during the Interlude of the Finals this Saturday, 8 February, as well as during the **Rising Stars** performance on Sunday, 9 February 2025.

Partner School Choreographic Project

Following the Young Creation Award, the audience at the Beaulieu Theatre attended the public rehearsal of the Partner School Choreographic Project. In just one week, choreographer Jessica Lang created and rehearsed an original piece with 26 young dancers from our partner schools. The result of their work will be presented during the Interlude of the Finals of the Prix de Lausanne, as well as during the **Rising Stars** performance, either on-site or via live streaming.
